What is a a vote-by-mail ballot?

A vote-by-mail ballot is a paper ballot, with the same candidates and measures on it as you would receive at your polling place on election day. The ballot is mailed to you with instructions on how to mark it and how to return it. (Note: a vote-by-mail ballot is the same as an “absentee ballot”).

Who Can Use a Vote-By-Mail Ballot?

Any registered voter may ask to vote using a vote-by-mail ballot. You do not have to be “absent” or “out of town on election day” to vote by mail. You may apply for a vote-by-mail ballot just because you want to.

We’re here to help! V.I.P. will be in the community helping people sign up for vote by mail and helping people get their ballots notarized.

All valid vote-by-mail ballots are counted regardless of the outcome or closeness of any race.

Request a vote-by-mail ballot (also called an absentee ballot) on the form provided by the County Elections Board.
